Croatia in numbers






Capital and Zagreb largest city

Good practice – Zagreb Urban Agglomeration

- Zagreb = 1/4 of Croatia (1 mio inhabitants)
- daily migration of 132.000 people
- economic resources
- infrastructure
- traffic and roads
- environment protection
- sustainability of natural resources

- 32 municipalities, 7 towns
